2. Decoding Methodology: The Atbash System

The Atbash Method and the Alef Bet

The **Atbash** system consists of bending the Hebrew alphabet on itself. This process is not merely linguistic, but reveals **distinct planes** of the biblical narrative that are not visible on the surface of the text.

- **Layers of Meaning:** Writing functions as a hyperlink; a word on the physical plane can represent a complex process on the spiritual plane.
- **Planes of Elohim:** The different "versions" of Elohim mentioned in Scripture reflect the opening of new planes of consciousness.

3. The Psychology of the Soul: Versions and Liberation

Compare these biblical characters, Lot and Sarai, with our own internal psychology.

Table of Personal Transformation Processes

Process	Definition	Metaphysical Objective

4. The Culmination: The Way of the Tzaddik and Yeshua

The final stage of the study connects individual responsibility with the messianic figure as a bridge of light.

- **The Tzaddik (Righteous One):** His task is to illuminate all regions of the heavens. He is not just someone "good", or "morally acceptable", but someone who manages light at all levels.
- **Yeshua as Priestly Mashiach:** Acts as the bridge that unites the worlds. Its function is to guide the ascent of the follower towards a transformation where the origin is no longer blood (biology), but light (spirituality).

Key Findings

1. **Reality is Multidimensional:** The Scriptures are a map of consciousness. By using methods such as Atbash, *the student ceases to be a reader and becomes an explorer of dimensions.*
2. **Dynamic Identity:** We are not static beings. We possess "versions" of ourselves that must be redeemed or released through the practice of immersion and conscious correction.
3. **Birth of Light:** The ultimate goal of these teachings is the transition from an existence based on the material and genetic to a purely luminous identity, facilitated by the guidance of the "Priestly Mashiach."
